This course is a behavioral science approach to profiling violent criminals and understanding their behavior. The thinking errors of sex offender's are the key to understanding their motives. Understanding their motives is the key to developing strategies for interrogation and getting that all important confession, admission and negating any insanity defense. The goal of this course is to improve the ability of both the new and experienced investigator in understanding violent sexual offenders.

Topic areas will include:

- Thinking Errors of Sexual Offenders - Molestation to Murder
- Criminal thinking is different than non-criminal. The sex offender also thinks differently than the ordinary criminal.
- Paraphilic Offenders (Sexual Deviant), Child Molesters (Situational or Preferential), Rapists (Power, Anger, Sadistic) and Lust Murders (The rare offender who kills not because he has to protect his identity but who has sexualized killing and demonstrates thru mutilation of his victim.).
